EagleRidge has developed a radon plan as required by ORS 332.167. Tests results will be made public and posted to the school website here: www.eagleridgehigh.com.

The radon plan includes that at least once every ten years the level of radon will be tested in any frequently occupied room in contact with the ground or located above a basement or a crawlspace. The initial test for radon will be performed prior to January 1, 2021. Results of the test will be provided to the Charter School Board, and made readily available to parents, guardians, students, school employees, school volunteers, administrators and community representatives at the EagleRidge High School office at 677 South Seventh Street and on the school's website at www.eagleridgehigh.com. The report will contain information regarding the level of radon at which the United States Environmental Agency recommends schools take action to reduce indoor radon concentrations.

EagleRidge High School will identify all taps used for drinking and food preparation and perform testing for lead in the water with an Oregon Health Authority accredited lab. The initial test will occur prior to January 1, 2017. EagleRidge will prevent access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion (ppb) of lead. This includes shutting off taps, covering water fountains, and providing bottled water to students and staff members. The results from the tests for lead in water will be made available to students, families, and the community as quickly as possible, as well as being posted on EagleRidge's website www.eagleridgehigh.com. Any sources of lead in the building plumbing will be replaced as needed. Testing will be done every five years.

EagleRidge High School was built after 1978 and does not have any lead paint issues.

EagleRidge has adopted an integrated pest management plan as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. Community members can access a copy of the IPM plan here:

EagleRidge High School will make all test results and detailed information explaining the test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results. Results will be made available by posting the results on the school website, via the email system and making the results available in hardcopy at the school office.
