

Dear EHS Families,

As we move forward with Comprehensive Distance Learning, we wanted to share with you the schedule and expectations for each student.

On August 21, Governor Brown stated that all schools in the state of Oregon will be teach in Comprehensive Distance Learning (CDL).

Our *first week* of school, September 8-11, will be broken down into four days by grade-level. Students will attend either in the morning or afternoon, based on their chosen AM or PM class times. Students will pick up their computers, be given instructions on the new layout of Canvas and learn about the expectations for CDL and how it differs from the spring. Initially, students will be receiving a laptop or a desktop depending on their class technology needs. We will need to know if students have hard-wire internet capabilities or need a wireless set up for their desktops. Freshman will attend on September 8, Sophomores on September 9, Juniors on September 10 and Seniors on September 11.

Starting the *second week* of school, September 14-18, students will attend classes on TEAMS four days a week and will have an opportunity for on-site supplemental support one day per week. Teachers will also have office hours daily in both the morning and afternoon. Students can also contact their teachers to schedule additional individual assistance.

ALL TEAMS classrooms will have links in Canvas to access each meeting.

Helpful terms to understand:

- Canvas – EagleRidge's online learning system. Every student and parent/guardian can login to Canvas to see/complete all coursework.
- Cohort – a group of students that is scheduled to take classes at the same time, either during the morning (AM) or afternoon (PM) or in a group that can attend school in person on Fridays for supplemental help (optional).
- TEAMS – a Microsoft version of Zoom that every student has free access to with their school login. This is the format that will be used to hold virtual classes.
- Office Hours – times set aside every day by every teacher to be available on TEAMS, by phone, text or by email to work individually with students and with small groups to provide extra help and feedback for students who request or need it.
- Distance Ed – a 5th class that all students will be enrolled in (various subjects/courses) that will be student guided and mostly on Canvas. Fridays are set aside for TEAMS meetings for these classes, with other check-ins scheduled throughout the week.

The schedule is as follows:

9:00-9:20: Sign into and participate in the Skillz (Advisory) Teams meeting

9:30-10:20: Sign into and participate in Block 1 (Monday & Wednesday) or Block 3 (Tuesday & Friday) on TEAMS

10:30-11:20: Sign into and participate in Block 2 (Monday & Wednesday) or Block 4 (Tuesday & Friday) on TEAMS

11:30-12:00: All Teachers will have Office Hours for additional student support

Afternoon Cohorts:

1:00-1:20: Sign into and participate in the Skillz (Advisory) Teams meeting

1:30-2:20: Sign into and participate in Block 1 (Monday & Wednesday) or Block 3 (Tuesday & Friday) on TEAMS

2:30-3:20: Sign into and participate in Block 2 (Monday & Wednesday) or Block 4 (Tuesday & Friday) on TEAMS

3:30-4:00: All Teachers will have Office Hours for additional student support

Fridays

9:30 –11:30: Distance Ed Check-Ins and Cohort Supplemental Supports

1:30-3:30: Distance Ed Check-Ins and Cohort Supplemental Supports
